"Turns out she was right, because after eventually letting her introduce us, we became friends straight away, started dating four months later, and were engaged a year after that. We still thank that friend all the time!!

Because Christi is a television presenter for Network Ten and Dean is a fitness trainer and businessman, the couple had to negotiate around their own career commitments, as well as that of Christi's high profile dad AFL Collingwood coach, Mick Malthouse, to pick a wedding date. That left only two weeks in November that they could feasibly hold their wedding.

"We ended up having a year to plan for the wedding, so it wasn't too stressful or hectic. Dean and I knew we wanted a wedding near the beach, and that we didn't want anything too formal. Once we booked the venue, the rest just fell into place."

Picking a theme for their nuptials was relatively simple as both Christi and Dean love the water. Securing Port Melbourne Yacht Club as their venue, the catchphrase became "Love by the Sea," which was printed on the invitations and reflected in the breezy, white and blue color scheme.

Christi is also a big fan of Asian-inspired design and worked with event stylist Brett Currell, to weave exotic elements into the surrounds.

"Brett came up with some amazing decorating ideas including a Buddha at the entrance with white lanterns inside and on the deck; and for the ceremony - prayer flags, mirrors, candles - and of course, beautiful flowers. It looked spectacular and was exactly what we wanted - beachy and elegant, with a touch of Asia."

Inspired by the French saying "If you want to know how great my love is, count the waves," Dean had 'Count the Waves' inscribed on his wedding band, while Christi repeated the quote on the name tags of guests who each received a

The ceremonial part of the marriage was short and informal; Christi and interspersed with Asiatic style elements. Y Christi was Dean wrote their own vows and performed a sand ceremony symbolising their partnership, while a close friend read a passage from Shakespeare's "Shall I Compare Thee to a Summer's Day?"


